## MAIN OPERATIONS

Survey, verify, and clear UNISFA priority routes and Joint Border Verification and Monitoring Mechanism (JBVMM) to ensure safe passage

Survey and clear UNISFA and JBVMM Safe Demilitarised Border Zone (SDBZ) priority areas of explosive hazards Provide JBVMM ground patrols with mine protected vehicles and demining crews to safely patrol the SDBZ Provide UNISFA with technical support and equipment in weapons and ammunition destruction in the Abyei Administrative Area

Provide landmine/ERW risk awareness to UNISFA personnel and communities at risk in the Abyei Administrative Area

- Route verification using Vehicle Mounted Mine Detection (VMMDS) and Explosive and Drug Detection (EDDS) systems
- Route clearance using manual mine clearance and mine detection dogs

#### TEAM COMPOSITION

Eight people for VMMDS and EDDS and twelve people for manual mine clearance, four mine detection dogs (MDD) and EOD specialists.

Twelve people per clearance team (team leader, EOD specialist, deminers, drivers, medic and mechanical clearance specialist).

Six people (driver, deminers, commander, medic, mechanic and radio operator) supporting a JBVMM ground patrol team. Three mine protected vehicles per team.

UNMAS WAM Officer, UNISFA military and police components.

UNMAS MRE Officer, nongovernmental organisations (grantees).
